
Work Party

The next work party will be on Saturday 28th October at 10.00, followed by free tea and coffee at 11 am. Please do come along and volunteer to help. Work parties are a great way to get to meet some of your fellow allotmenteers and help keep the allotments in good order. Previous work parties have helped tackle some of the untidy or overgrown plots to prepare them for letting.

In addition, walking around the site I notice a lot of the communal paths are overgrown, or blocked by overhanging trees and bushes. This is making it increasingly difficult to move around the site and poses a safety risk for people to get access to their plots. Please take some time this Autumn to check the paths around your plot, trim back overgrown edges and grass, clear away any rubbish, prune any bushes and trim overhanging tree branches back to your plot boundary. This will make it easier and safer to move around the site.

The Arium - New Leeds City Council Parks Nursery

Many of you will have been familiar with the old City Parks Department's nursery at Red Hall. You'll be pleased to know that this month they have just moved into a brand new purpose-built facility, 'The Arium', on Thorner Lane, Whinmoor, LS14 3FB. A very striking feature of the new nursery is its 19,000 square metre glasshouse, which will grow over three million plants a year for the City's parks, roundabouts, school grounds and other locations across the City to support 'Leeds in Bloom'.



The site is well worth a visit, with a cafe and a children's play area and great quality plants for sale. Remember that as a Member of



the Ash Road Allotment Association (and therefore also the Leeds and District Allotment Gardeners' Federation) you should be able to claim a discount on prices at the shop, so remember to ask!
